The Canadian Fallen Heroes is asking for your help:

For the past ten years, The Canadian Fallen Heroes Foundation has partnered with private and public organizations to put a face to the fallen, to share a glimpse into the lives of our soldiers and preserve their memory through memorial. The Moosomin Legion Branch #81 is one of these partners. The legion hopes to display a print for all named on their cenotaph. They took charge and helped by collecting photographs and sponsorships at the branch and working with the local newspaper and community organizations who help get the word out to the citizens. As a result, they have half of 80 names on the cenotaphs completed, and on the wall at their legion.

The time and money saved by the Foundation is substantial and they preferred in lieu of a cash donation, the Foundation donate additional plaques to the Legion in appreciation of the time and effort they put forth. This type of commitment is difficult for most and not expected, but should you wish to help facilitate the local campaign, please advise. "The memorials play a pivotal role in our Remembrance Day Ceremonies, no longer are the names on the cenotaph the names of people whose stories have been slowly forgotten, because of this project each of the 68 fallen heroes stories will be remembered for generations to come." I have checked with the provincial government and have all their requirements for keeping reindeer and would make sure everything was always up to code.

I am writing to you to see if it might be possible to apply to Town Council for special permission to raise a few reindeer within town limits? Dear Town of Maple Creek Mayor and Council,

The RM of Maple Creek has decided to put a weigh scale East of the RM compound. The scale is 80 feet by 11 feet and is self-sufficient. The high costs of feed and the changing methods of selling cattle the need of a scale is becoming crucial to the agricultural industry. This offers our ratepayers a way to have accurate weighs of product ensuring fair trade. There is no fee for the use of the scale.

The RM will be upgrading approaches to accommodate the traffic to use the scale. The scale is considered portable but it will be constructed as a permanent type would be. The only permanent requirement are four cement pads. We will also have to trench power to the location.
